


Latino Workplace Project

Workplace wellness programs can assist in improving employee health and well-being by boosting morale and retention while decreasing absenteeism and turnover. The Health Equity Action Research Team (HEART) collaborated with small (10 employees or less) Latino-owned businesses to identify key barriers and facilitators to adopting health promotion interventions in their businesses. They also focused on determining how Connect to Wellness could be culturally and structurally tailored for Latino-owned businesses.
